Women in Mathematics for Social Change & Sustainable Livelihoods!

The African Women in Mathematics Association (AWMA) was established in July 2013, in Capetown, South Africa, to promote mathematics and African women mathematicians. For this purpose, AWMA organizes activities such as meetings, workshops and conferences.

The 2015 AMUCWMA - AWMA workshop will be held in Naivasha, Kenya at the Lake Naivasha Panorama Park, Naivasha. This is the first annual general meeting of AWMA since its establishment, and its main purpose is to bring together African women mathematicians from the continent to advance the association's agenda, of promoting mathematics and women mathematicians in Africa. The workshop gives young women in science and mathematics the opportunity to meet role models other professional women who have successfully pursued scientific and mathematically-oriented careers.

BACKGROUND: Women in Mathematics for social change.

The workshop of African Women Mathematicians will be held during the period 16th-18th July 2015, at Lake Naivasha Panorama Park, Naivasha, Kenya. The theme of the workshop is "Women in Mathematics for Social Change and Sustainable Livelihoods"

This workshop is a follow-up workshop among a series workshops jointly organized by AMUCWMA (African Mathematical Union Commission on Women in Mathematics in Africa) and CIMPA. The first one was held in Ouagadougou (Burkina Faso), 26th–27th October 2012, and the second one was held at the African Institute of Mathematical Sciences (AIMS), Cape Town, 17th – 19th of July 2013.
